WHERE'S THE GOLD?

Without going through a long story of how I ended up at this lo- cation after a few wrong turns, I was more than


happy to have stumbled on this site. You may recognize this spot as the background from a detector field test a while back. I wanted to wait until WTG switched from summer water prospecting to winter desert prospect- ing to roll this one out.

I walked right to a nugget patch after visually prospecting this view for 30 minutes while breaking out my detector gear and my favorite dry pan to do some additional testing. Why a pan? Look closely and you will find what I thought could be an old hard rock mine, which it turned out it was. And with that, I will always look for broken-out disseminated

residual material hoping to find some gold.

The mine is the cornerstone of this WTG. You are seeing this from the same view I saw it from, and nothing really jumps out, but it is all there. I had to convince myself that there was a mine adit in the view.

This is a two-part WTG search; the first one is for the nugget patch (white outline) and the second is for the spot that I ultimately dry- washed (green outline) after dry panning a good amount of gold on my first trip while I was field testing the detector. The patch and the fines are indirectly connected, and if you find one it leads to the other.

If you found the adit (right above the green circle D) then you are on the right track.

DRYWASHFINDS

I'll skip all the non-gold sites and jump right to the answer. B) Green.

D (green) did not look right from the beginning, and you can see why to some extent. That gold loves gravity thing that I mentioned earlier, yeah it plays a major role here. The light-colored rock that is running horizontally through the green D, and just about in line with the D, is a small ridge that then runs up toward the saguaro in white B and channeled all of the material into B from most likely over a century of rain, leaving B green as the runoff point. The bedrock that you can see next to B green stopped almost all of the gold, and over the years as floodwaters hit the bedrock, it deposited flood layer after flood layer of gold down almost three feet.

OVERALL

The end result was a pocket of flood-layered gold at the bed- rock point (B green) and flood gold layers from the bottom center of B white. The nugget patch gave up a few very nice nuggets. Total finds: nuggets, 8.3gm total, and 6gm of dry- wash gold. That included a few pickers I gave away as presents with 4.6gm 20-100 mesh left.

A. Is a ridge that is clearly visible from my view of the area. Gold will do a lot of things, but since it loves gravity so much going uphill is not really an option.

B. This spot drew me into it as soon as I saw it. Pretty flat with the land contour favoring a left-to-right draw. The first nugget came out of the left side just above the top of the saguaro in the photo.

C. Interesting looking flat, which turned out to be where the miners were camped. Lots of rusted cans and a few spikes. In the long run, I raked and dragged a magnet around the area to make sure they had not set up camp on a patch without having to dig every piece of trash on the site. **D.** I didn't have a lot of hope for this spot coming into it, and as I expected, nothing but a few hot rocks and some old trash.
