MEETING MINUTES



May 7, 2025, COSGPAA Meeting Minutes

Attendees: 21 in person; 165 by e-mail

The May monthly meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Chapter President Tim Pitney and began with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Tim discussed the May 2-4 outing to the Railroad Bridge (RRB) claims, attended by more than 20 members and guests. Although rain had been forecast, the weather was beautiful all three days and the water level in the Arkansas River was way down exposing a lot of mid-stream prospecting opportunities. Unfortunately, the increased access included a greater risk of falls on the exposed cobble bars which claimed one of our members twice. Also access to much of the river on this claim is very steep and would require professional rescue efforts should an injury cause a broken bone or a loss of consciousness. "When I prospect, I always carry a long-handled, #2 round point shovel. It provides a third-leg balance point on steep or uneven terrain, can be used as a prybar to move rocks, an aide to stand up after kneeling too long, and of course, a tool to move dirt," Alton Oakes. Members and guests were reminded that they are individually responsible for their own safety as well as the safety of their guests. A discussion with US Forest Service Rangers who were visiting the campground revealed that we should call them

first if an emergency should occur and they will then contact and coordinate the appropriate agency response (EMT, ambulance, medi-vac, search/rescue). Most, but not all, rangers have first aid training and experience.

To support our outing participants, our sign-in sheets will add a space for an emergency contact name and phone number. Anyone prospecting (hiking, fishing, mountain biking, etc.) alone should tell someone of their plans and ask them to notify emergency services if they do not return or check-in as scheduled. Chapter Treasurer Alton Oakes gave the financial report and discussed the annual Chapter picnic scheduled for Saturday, August 2nd. Details will be provided at the June 4th regular meeting. At the May RRB outing, several members donated buckets of ¼" screened paydirt to the Chapter from their respective dig locations. Three 3-gallon buckets were auctioned at the meeting. The remaining paydirt will be available at future meetings or concentrated and used in the panning station at the picnic. Alton gave a quick demonstration on the use of snuffer bottles and identifying the differences with similar looking bottles that do not work.
